BERWYN CITY COUNCIL
JANUARY 12, 2010

1. The regular meeting of the Berwyn City Council was called to order by Mayor Lovero at 8:00 p.m. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present: Chapman, Boyajian, Paul, Skryd, Santoy, Polashek, Avila, Laureto.
2. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silence for the deceased 4th Ward resident & Korean veteran, Charles Borowik, and for the safety of our men and women on the streets and for the armed forces protecting our country.
3. The Open Forum portion of the meeting was announced. The Mayor recognized resident from 1630 Kenilworth who spoke regarding our children at Morton West High School and requested security cameras, speed bumps on Home Avenue, and would also like to see school speed zone signage on Home Avenue. Brian Dillon, 1916 Kenilworth spoke regarding the 15% Tax Levy after posting a 5% Truth in Taxation notice. Sabina Krause spoke on behalf of the 16th Street Theater and encouraged all to attend the third season and presented brochures to the Mayor and members of the City Council. Mayor Lovero announced that the Railroad Quiet Zone will take affect on January 28, 2010 and handed out a press release. Alderman Paul stated that the railroad median on Harlem Avenue is near completion. Alderman Boyajian thanked the public works department and Director Schiller for snow removal during the recent snow fall. Alderman Laureto thanked members of the public works department for response and repair of a water main leak. Alderman Paul also announced that she will host 3rd Ward meetings on the 3rd Wednesday of every month at the Peace Center, at 6833 W. Stanley Avenue with the 1st meeting being scheduled for Wednesday, January 20, 2010 from 7-9 p.m.
4. The minutes of the regular City Council meeting, the Special City Council meeting on December 28, 2009 and the Committee of the Whole held on December 22, 2009 were submitted. Thereafter, Skryd made a motion, seconded by Boyajian, to concur and approve as submitted. The motion carried by a voice vote.

5. The Mayor submitted a proclamation honoring Roger Terrance Connelly for receiving scouting's highest honor of Eagle Scout. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Avila, to concur and **adopt** the proclamation as presented. The motion carried by a voice vote.
6. The Mayor submitted a proclamation honoring Gregory Adam Ryan for receiving scouting's highest honor of Eagle Scout. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Avila, to concur and **adopt** the proclamation as presented. The motion carried by a voice vote.
7. The Mayor submitted a proclamation honoring Thomas J. Williams for receiving scouting's highest honor of Eagle Scout. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to concur and **adopt** the proclamation as presented. The motion carried by a voice vote. Thereafter, the Mayor recognized the three young men for their accomplishments.
8. The Mayor submitted a communication for Honorable Mention to City of Berwyn, public works employee, John Marchand, citizen, Jorge L. Davila, and citizen Okawian P. Dudek for their quick response and rescue of a Berwyn resident from his burning vehicle on Wednesday, December 30, 2009 and presented them with a Meritorious Award for their outstanding citizenship and bravery. Thereafter, the Mayor recognized the three individuals and congratulations were extended to all. Thereafter, Skryd made a motion, seconded by Boyajian, to concur. The motion carried by a voice vote.
9. Skryd made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to suspend the rules and bring forth item J-7. The motion carried by a voice vote. Item J-7 is separate communications from the Police Chief and the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners regarding the swearing in of six Probationary Patrol officers, Matthew Boskovich, Rita Hadadiyan, Timothy M. Keske, Brian Koski, Ronald Pedecone, and Charles A. Schauer. Thereafter, Clerk Pavlik administered the Oath of Office. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Avila, to concur and approve the six new hires. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.
10. The Mayor submitted a communication requesting the removal of referrals items from the Committee of the Whole referral list. Thereafter, Skryd made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to concur and accept the matter as informational. The motion carried by a voice vote.
11. The Clerk submitted an ordinance entitled:

13. The Building, Zoning, and Planning Committee submitted a report from a meeting held on January 5, 2010 regarding a change to Chapter #14 regarding a maximum 400 square footage for dormers. Thereafter, Laureto seconded by Chapman, to refer back to the Building, Zoning, and Planning Committee and the Building Director. The motion carried by voice vote.
14. The City Administrator submitted a communication regarding the recommendation of Cleaning Services with the recommendation to award to ABC Commercial, Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$110,496.00. Thereafter, Skryd made a motion, seconded by Avila, to concur and approve as submitted and to authorize the corporate authorities to enter into an agreement. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.
15. The City Attorney and Traffic Engineer submitted an ordinance entitled:
AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING STOP CONTROLLED STREETS AT CERTAIN LOCATIONS AND AMENDING CHAPTER 460 OF THE TRAFFIC CODE OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BERWYN



MINUTES
COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE
JANUARY 12, 2010

1. The Committee of the Whole was called to order by Mayor Lovero at 6:01 p.m. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present: Chapman, Boyajian, Paul, Skryd, Avila, Laureto. Absent: Santoy, Polashek. A sign in sheet is attached.
2. Boyajian made a motion, seconded by Avila, to excuse Aldermen Santoy and Polashek. The motion carried by a voice vote.
3. The Mayor stated that the police department would like to advertise for two telecommunication operators and two parking enforcement officers. The Mayor asked for a consensus to go out for advertisement to hire two telecommunicators and two parking enforcement officers, with Council, 6-0 in favor if granting permission to proceed with advertisement for positions.
4. Age Options-The Mayor recognized Rebecca Burgstahler of Age Options who gave a presentation regarding the Maturing of Illinois, stating that this is to prepare for the Baby Boomer population which is causing unprecedented growth in senior residents, stating the over the next 3 years, Age Options will be conducting a comprehensive community assessment to be conducted in collaboration with citizens, local governments, and organizations and that they will be conducting surveys on the following topics:
 - Health and Human Services
 - Housing
 - Transportation
 - Work Force/Economic Development
 - Land Use
 - Public Safety
 - Emergency Preparedness
 - Recreation
 - Lifelong Education
 - Civic EngagementMs. Burgstahler went on to state that 6 suburban Cook County communities have been selected for this initial assessment process, Village of Wheeling, City of DesPlaines, City of Berwyn, Village of Lyons, City of Chicago Heights, and Village of Oak Lawn, stating that Age Options staff and volunteers would be reaching out to key informants in these 6 communities to look at how they are prepared for the next Age Wave.

Additionally, the self assessment strategies, resources, and best practices will be shared with all 130 communities in suburban Cook County. The projected number of people over age 60 in the State of Illinois is projected to increase by 3.6 million in the year 2030, which will represent a 77% increase. The number of persons over the age of 85 is projected to increase by 109% with minority persons over the age of 60 increasing by 220%. This unprecedented shift in demographics will impact Illinois communities in every aspect, physical, social, and fiscal, reminding all, that preparing for Age Wave is preparing for our future. For more information on Age Options and the Age Wave can be found on their website at www.ageoptions.org.

5. Open Meeting Act-The Mayor referred to City Clerk, Tom Pavlik, who reviewed a few key points regarding the City Council complying with the Open Meeting Act and the new changes in the law. Clerk Pavlik reviewed the following:
 1. City Council Quorum, stating that the City Council is comprised of 9 members, Mayor Lovero and the 8 Aldermen, and that a quorum is a total of 6 members and a majority of a quorum is 4 and therefore, no more than 3 members may ever meeting without notice of a duly called City Council meeting.
 2. Quorum and How it applies to Committee Meetings-The Committees are comprised of 3 members, which is a subcommittee of the City Council and therefore, 3 members of the City Council may meet without being in violation of a quorum or a majority of a quorum of the City Council and still act as a sub-committee, independent of the City Council. Pavlik noted that once more than 3 Council members are in attendance of a committee meeting, it constitutes a majority of a quorum, therefore, technically a violation of the Open Meeting Act, and reviewed methods on how to avoid this situation.
 3. Joint Meeting-2 Committees may have a single item referred to each of the committees independently and that the 2 committees may call a joint committee meeting, but may only discuss the referral that applies to both committees, and should take votes independently of each other, for report back to Council.
 4. Agendas-The individual committee's referral items serve as the agenda unless otherwise noted. If the committee wishes to meet to discuss new business, the same should be noted and posted accordingly.
 5. Minutes-Simple minutes are only required at the committee meetings, i.e. day, time, attendance, matter discussed, and action


taken. When no action is taken, minutes are still required to be taken and placed on the Council floor as informational, stating matter discussed with no action taken.

Pavlik also noted that the new law requires a minimum of 2 individuals from each municipality to be designated as an Open Meeting's Act officers and undergo the online training requirements provided by the Illinois Attorney General's office. Pavlik stated that he and his staff will undergo the training which is available as of January 15, 2010, but suggest that all members of the City Council, Mayor, City Administrator, and all the Chairmans' of Boards and Commissions of the City of Berwyn also participate and take the on line training, which will insure that all committees, commissions, and boards, will be compliant with the new laws. Pavlik will address same at a later date with a communication on the City Council floor regarding same.

6. Agenda Item G-1-An Ordinance Establishing a Procedure to Amend Chapter 1240. Clerk Pavlik noted that a revised copy of the ordinance marked G-1 has been provided to all of the aldermen. Discussion ensued on amending Chapter 1240, with Alderman Skryd questioning same, and the possible need for a Public Hearing to amend any part of Chapter 1200. The Mayor stated that he has been advised from numerous legal Counsels, including Sterk, DelGaldo, and Attorney Bertuca, stating that this is acceptable as a text amendment, because Berwyn is a Home Rule Municipality. The Mayor stated that the amended version still needs to be amended on face and to remove the Reference to Map as well as changing Village Clerk to City Clerk.
7. Agenda item J-4-Clerk Pavlik noted that these are 3 ordinances updating and reflecting changes to Curb and Loading Zones, and that 3 separate motions are needed. Alderman Chapman also questioned J-6, a communication from the Police Chief regarding promotions, inquiring if the officers were being promoted this evening. The Mayor stated that the Council is just giving the Chief permission to move forward with the promotions, but the names of the individual involved, other than those retiring, have not been submitted at this time. The Mayor stated that Chief Kushner will be available at the City Council meeting this evening for questions regarding same.
8. Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to close the Committee of the Whole for pending litigation, land acquisition, and review of closed Committee of the Whole minutes. The motion carried by a voice vote at 6:37 p.m.

9. Avila made a motion, seconded by Polashek, to reopen the Committee of the Whole at 7:55 p.m. The motion carried by a voice vote.
10. Boyajian made a motion, seconded by Polashek, to adjourn the Committee of the Whole at 7:55 p.m. The motion carried by a voice vote.



TIF assistance will be applied to interior and exterior renovations and signage for their commercial space. The TIF scope of work includes, interior build-out consisting of: demolition, carpentry, electrical, HVAC, paint and wallpaper, plumbing, and signage.

Based on this information, the City Council is being asked to approve TIF monies to pay only the eligible costs associated with this project up to a maximum of \$43,415.00. 

On behalf of the West Cook County Housing Collaborative, I am writing to encourage your community to adopt the Metropolitan Mayors Caucus' Housing Endorsement Criteria. As you know, the Metropolitan Mayors Caucus represents the local elected officials in the six-county Chicago region. These Criteria were first created by the Caucus in 2002. This fall, they were adopted by the West Cook County Housing Collaborative Steering Committee to help us guide our housing efforts; in turn, we hope that each of our member communities will adopt them as well.

The Endorsement Criteria were created to redefine how communities talked about housing issues. The Endorsement Criteria identify housing that is well-designed, well-maintained, near jobs and transit and available to people with a range of incomes as the type of housing that Mayors value. These Criteria speak directly to the housing that already exists and we hope to rehabilitate and preserve in the West Cook County region. While many of our communities are built-out and don't expect to add many more large developments in the future, we all have opportunities for infill housing. Adopting the Criteria reiterates each community's commitment to well-designed and well-maintained housing.

The Criteria were adopted by the full Metropolitan Mayors Caucus in 2002 and have subsequently been adopted by a number of communities and programs around the region. Adopting the Criteria does not mean that you are bound to any specific decision-making process; rather, they exist to help guide development decisions going forward and to reinforce the message to developers and the overall community that you want to see quality housing built and maintained in your town.

HOUSING ENDORSEMENT CRITERIA

A variety of recent housing studies document that the median home price in most job growth corridors places homeownership out of reach for many working families. Furthermore, during the 1990s, the six-county Chicago region grew by 11 percent in population and 16 percent in jobs, but lost more than 28,000 apartments. Private sector interest in housing investment is becoming stronger. For our region to remain competitive, we must expand the supply of housing options to meet growing demands. By securing broad-based support for these Housing Endorsement Criteria, municipal leaders, neighbors, employers and community-based organizations can more effectively attract, identify and promote proposals for quality developments.

To promote housing and mixed-use developments that meet community needs while also addressing broader regional sensible growth goals, new housing should meet most of the principles and criteria below:

GENERAL PRINCIPLES

Promote Economic Development and Sustainability

Housing, when appropriately located, encourages the expansion of existing and the location of new businesses and industries within the region. The mismatch between where the jobs are and where workers can afford to live has significant costs. Increasingly, employers recognize that local housing for all levels of their workforce promotes stability and productivity for the workers as well as the individual company.

Encourage an Array of Quality Housing Options throughout the Region

Developments with units at price points accessible to a wide range of income levels are needed to provide the local workforce and residents with a housing supply that is critically needed and currently lacking. By the year 2020, northeastern Illinois is expected to increase 25 percent in population, or 1.5 million people, and the housing market must be expanded at all price points to accommodate this dramatic growth.

Support Innovative Community Development and Design

Quality residential and mixed-use developments maintain, enhance, or create livable streets, neighborhoods, and public spaces oriented to the pedestrian. A variety of housing types provides a healthy mix of residents from different age groups, racial and cultural backgrounds, income levels, and household types. New developments foster a sense of community, while promoting people's choice of housing, privacy, and convenient access to nearby amenities.

Provide for Mixed Uses Within a Neighborhood

In order to enhance community livability and decrease auto dependency, a mix of land uses within a neighborhood combine residential with retail, restaurants, schools, and other amenities in close proximity. The location of schools, entertainment districts, parks, businesses, institutions, and recreational facilities will be consciously integrated with new and existing residential developments to encourage ease of pedestrian access.

Minimize Cost of Municipal Services

Clustering housing near existing infrastructure minimizes the per capita costs of municipal services by allowing for more efficiency and economies of scale.

Promote the Use of Public Transit

Housing, together with commercial space and public amenities, should be planned for, and built first, within walking distance of existing or planned transit service in order to strengthen transit ridership and decrease traffic congestion.

Support Sensible Growth

There are ample opportunities within existing service areas of our older cities and suburbs to provide for a portion of projected housing needs over the next 20 years. Infill development and redevelopment within existing municipal areas and conservation developments are of tremendous value. Adhering to development policies that encourage compact, mixed-use development will promote an array of housing types and expand individual choice. This will advance other regional and community needs, such as the protection of open space and the growth of the local tax base.

SPECIFIC CRITERIA

Location

Infill development and redevelopment within existing cities and towns, as well as new conservation developments, will receive preference. In order to maximize compatibility with public transit and minimize auto use, housing within one mile of major transit service, a job hub or town center, provides a future market for transit. The project may be within two miles of a rail transit station if provisions are made to provide ongoing shuttle service to the future residents. Major transit service is defined as a bus or rail stop with peak period wait times of no more than 30 minutes. Major transit service also includes funded, but not yet built, fixed rail stations.

Land-Use

New developments that aim to cluster housing in an efficient manner, in context with the surrounding community, to preserve natural resources and open space will be given priority attention. Higher densities and mixed uses are particularly appropriate near Metra and CTA stations to reduce the growth of traffic congestion on local and regional roads.

Attainability

Mixed-income housing developments, which include units accessible to moderate-income working families and to households with lower incomes, along with market rate units in the same complex, will be given preference. Developments that help balance affordability levels within communities, while assuring consistent quality and design, will receive strong support.

Design

New developments that stress quality design and construction to help ensure their long-term contribution to the improvement of the neighborhood will be given preference. The proposed buildings will fit their setting, complementing and enhancing the existing neighborhood, and promoting a sense of community, pedestrian friendly design and the other principles of good village design. Proposals will address transit use and access and, where appropriate, the potential for mixed use.

Management

The management and maintenance of developments are as critical as the initial design and construction to meeting the goals of enhancing communities. Therefore, the capacity of the development team to successfully address long-term needs, as evidenced by its track record in selling, leasing and managing development properties, and its history with neighborhood and/or tenant relations, will also be considered.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Berwyn (the "Corporate Authorities") has adopted a Traffic Code, which has been amended from time to time; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities recognize that parking regulations are important to the fabric and safety of the community and must be upheld; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities determine that it is in the best interests of the residents of the City to amend the Codified Ordinances as set forth below.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its Home Rule Powers, as follows:

Section 1: That the above recitals and legislative findings are incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

Section 2: Section 480.08 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois is hereby amended to read as follows (with proposed additions underlined and proposed deletions ~~stricken~~):

480.08 PROHIBITED PARKING

In addition to the portions of the Illinois vehicle Code, adopted and listed under section 420.01 Portions Adopted, parking is prohibited at the times, days and locations as contained in this section.

(a) Parking Prohibited at all times and days:

- (1) North side of Riverside Drive from the Library Parking Lot west to Harlem Avenue.
- (2) South side of Riverside Drive from Harlem Avenue to Maple Avenue.
- (3) **East side of Ridgeland Avenue starting at the alley south of Roosevelt Road continuing 85 feet south of the alley.**
- (4) **North side of 35th Street from Ridgeland Avenue to Cuyler Avenue.**
- (5) **South side of 35th Street from Ridgeland Avenue east to the first alley.**

Section 3. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

Re: Speed Regulations Ordinance

Per the Illinois Vehicle Code, the speed limit for urban classified streets is 30 mph unless posted otherwise. The west side of Lombard Avenue is 30 mph throughout the majority of the City since signs indicating otherwise are not posted. However, the east side of Lombard Avenue under Cicero's Jurisdiction is posted 20 mph in areas. This is confusing to drivers and difficult to enforce. I have coordinated with officials at the Town of Cicero on this issue. For reasons of safety and uniformity, it is my recommendation that the speed limit on Lombard Avenue is 20 mph.

The remaining speed limits included in the attached ordinance were established per past ordinances or are properly signed the length of roadway.

Recommendation

It is my recommendation that the speed limit on Lombard Avenue is reduced to 20 mph and the attached ordinance is approved.

WHEREAS, the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois (the "*City*") is a home rule municipality pursuant to Section 6(a), Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and as such may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs (the "*Home Rule Powers*"); and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Berwyn (the "Corporate Authorities") has adopted a Traffic Code, which has been amended from time to time; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities recognize that the statutory vehicular speed limits established by Section 5/11-605 of the Illinois Vehicle Code are greater than that considered reasonable for the roadways listed herein ; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities determine that it is in the best interests of the residents of the City to amend the Codified Ordinances as set forth below.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its Home Rule Powers, as follows:

Section 1: That the above recitals and legislative findings are incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

Section 2: The Codified Ordinances of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois is hereby amended by adding the following new Chapter to read as follows:

460.07 SPEED REGULATIONS

Certain streets shall be designated at a rate of speed lower than the provisions as specified in the Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/1-100 et seq). The rate of speed on the streets or parts of streets as described below shall be at the rate designated in this section, and it shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle at a rate of speed greater than that designated.

- (a) Twenty (20) miles per hour
 - (1) Lombard Avenue from Roosevelt Road to Pershing Road (39th Street)
 - (2) 34th Street from Harlem Avenue to Ridgeland Avenue
 - (3) 27th Street from East Avenue to Ridgeland Avenue
 - (4) 27th Place from East Avenue to Ridgeland Avenue
 - (5) 28th Street from East Avenue to Ridgeland Avenue
 - (6) 28th Place from East Avenue to Ridgeland Avenue

- (b) Twenty five (25) miles per hour
 - (1) 16th Street from Harlem Avenue to Lombard Avenue
 - (2) Riverside Drive from Harlem Avenue to Wesley Avenue
 - (3) Windsor Avenue from Harlem Avenue to Ridgeland Avenue

A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE FOR THE 2010 FISCAL YEAR FOR THE LEASE OF EQUIPMENT BY THE RECREATION DEPARTMENT FROM PITNEY BOWES IN THE CITY OF BERWYN, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois (the "City") is a home rule municipality pursuant to Section 6(a), Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and as such may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs (the "Home Rule Powers"); and

WHEREAS, the City of Berwyn has an existing lease with Pitney Bowes Global Financial Services LLC (Lease No. 4238334-403) for a postage meter located in the Recreation Department; and,

WHEREAS, the aforementioned lease is non-cancelable but can be terminated under the "non-appropriation clause"; and,

WHEREAS, the City's appropriation ordinance for 2010 has not yet been adopted by City Council and is not required to be adopted until March 31, 2010; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Berwyn is authorized by Illinois law to adopt supplemental appropriations prior to the end of the fiscal year in amounts necessary to recognize the expenditure of municipal obligations in certain departments and funds in excess of the expenditures identified in the City's annual appropriation ordinance.

THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED THAT, the City Council of the City of Berwyn, by and through its Home Rule Powers, adopts a Supplemental Appropriation Ordinance as set forth below:

SECTION 1: That the above recitals and legislative findings are incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

SECTION 2: That the Recreation Department be allocated supplemental appropriation in an amount sufficient to make the monthly lease payments under Lease No. 4238334-403 with Pitney Bowes Global Financial Services LLC

SECTION 3: If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 4: All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 5: Any non-preemptive state statute in conflict hereof with the ordinance is hereby superceded to the full extent of such conflict pursuant to the exercise of the Home Rule Powers of the City.

SECTION 6: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

Attached is a letter from Camp Dresser & McKee (CDM) requesting City Council approval of the Engineer's Payment Estimate dated January 4, 2010 and Final for the 2009 Water Tank Repair awarded to Neumann Company Contractors, Inc. (NCCI).

In May of 2009 the City entered into an agreement with CDM for Engineering Services and project coordination for spot repainting and structural evaluation of the at grade four million gallon water storage tank located at the Public Works Facility. The spot repainting has been completed and NCCI opened the tank for a detailed inspection and recommendation of repairs by CDM. The recommended repairs were not critical in nature but need to be completed within the next year or two. 


