

DECEMBER 13, 2011

1. The regular meeting of the Berwyn City Council was called to order by Mayor Lovero at 8:00 p.m. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present: Chapman, Boyajian, Paul, Skryd, Santoy, Polashek Avila and Laureto.
2. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silence was had for the Men and Women on the streets of Berwyn protecting our safety along with the Men and Women in the Armed Forces.
3. The Open Forum portion of the meeting was announced. Jim Douden, from the N. E. Corner Harlem and Cermak Vitamin Shoppe and Fred Guzman, Store Manager, invited everyone to attend the grand opening on February 6, 2012. The Mayor congratulated Alderman Nora Laureto on the birth of her Granddaughter, Abigail. In addition to the communications on the council floor regarding honorable mentions, the Mayor stated that there were two fires, at the same time, in Berwyn last night, one on the North end and the other on the South end of town. The Mayor noted and thanked two Berwyn Police Officers, who were first on the scene at one, that helped rescue individuals from the fire. Alderman Paul announced a 3<sup>rd</sup> Ward Town Meeting on January 26, 2012 at 7:30 p.m. at Heritage Middle School, 6850 W. 31<sup>st</sup> Street.



Pabst explained that he thoroughly reviewed this provider's contract and that he has reviewed numerous proposals, from various energy providers. This is the most comprehensive and complete proposal he has reviewed and that if we lock in today, the city can save approximately \$7,000-\$10,000 dollars.



He will come back to council, sometime early in 2012, with the best proposal after further research. 



**INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN  
THE CITY OF BERWYN AND THE NORTH BERWYN PARK DISTRICT  
REGARDING POLICING OF PARK PROPERTY**

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into by and between the NORTH BERWYN PARK DISTRICT (hereinafter referred to as the "District") and the CITY OF BERWYN (hereinafter referred to as the "City"), both municipal corporations located in the County of Cook, State of Illinois;

**WITNESSETH:**

**WHEREAS**, the Illinois Constitution provides that units of local government may contract to share services through intergovernmental agreements, Ill.Const., Art. VII, §10 (1970); and

**WHEREAS**, Illinois statutes provide that public agencies may share powers through Intergovernmental agreements pursuant to the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (5 ILCS 220/1 et seq. (1991)); and

**WHEREAS**, the District desires that its laws, ordinances, rules and regulations be enforced by the City within its parks, grounds and facilities; and

**WHEREAS**, the City operates a police force including police officers and required vehicles and equipment; and

**WHEREAS**, the City has determined that it is feasible and appropriate that its police officers enforce the laws, ordinances, rules and regulations of the District within its parks, grounds and facilities within the corporate limits of the City; and

**WHEREAS**, the City and the District wish to associate, cooperate and share services to achieve the goals and objectives expressed herein and to enter into an intergovernmental agreement that so provides.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual agreements and covenants contained in this Agreement, the District and the City agree as follows:

**Section 1:** City police officers shall be authorized at all times to enforce the laws, ordinances, rules and regulations of the District upon the parks, grounds and facilities of the District within the corporate limits of the City and to sign and file complaints for any violation thereof. Under this provision, no City police officers, vehicles or equipment shall be specifically designated for park patrol, but rather in the normal course of patrol and on call, the City police officers shall so enforce the laws in the parks, grounds and facilities of the District. The District shall make no payment to the City for the enforcement services as set out in this Section

**Section 2:** The police officers of the City shall remain under the command of the City's Chief of Police at all times. At all times, City police officers shall remain employees and agents of the City. As employees of the City, the police officers shall have full and exclusive control over the

specific means, manner and methods used in providing the law enforcement and police services contemplated by this agreement.

It is further understood that said police officers are not agents or employees of the Park District and are therefore not entitled to any benefits provided employees of Park District.

**Section 3:** This Agreement shall not be construed as to limit in any way the authority or ability of the police officers of the City to enforce the laws of the City, State of Illinois and United States as otherwise authorized by applicable law, either on or off of the property of the District.

**Section 4:** Members of the City Police Department, acting hereunder to enforce the laws on District property, shall be conservators of the peace within and upon such parks and property controlled by the District and shall have the power to make arrests on view of the offense, or upon warrants, for violation of any of the laws, rules, regulations or ordinances of the District, or for any breach of the peace, in the same manner as police in cities or villages organized and existing under the general laws of the State of Illinois.

**Section 5:** The prosecutor for the City shall prosecute any citation written by a police officer alleging violation of a District law, ordinance, rule or regulation, and is hereby authorized to represent the District with reference thereto. The District shall pay the prosecutor for the prosecutor's service hereunder. The District shall pay over all fines and revenue collected hereunder to the City within 30 days of receipt thereof; it being agreed between the parties that such revenues will help reimburse the City for the expenses it incurs hereunder.

**Section 6:** To the fullest extent permitted by law, each party shall protect, indemnify, save, defend and hold harmless the other party, including its officers, officials, volunteers, employees and agents, from and against any and all liabilities, obligations, claims, damages, penalties, causes of action, costs and expenses, including reasonable attorney and paralegal fees, which the other party and for which its officers, officials, volunteers, employees and agents may become obligated by reason of any accident, bodily injury, death of person, or loss of or damage to tangible property, or civil and/or constitutional infringement of rights (specifically including violations of the Federal Civil Rights Statutes) arising indirectly or directly in connection with or under, or as a result of this agreement; but only to the extent caused in whole or in part by any negligent or wrongful act or omission of the indemnifying party.

In the event either party purchases insurance from an insurance company, it shall keep in force at all times during the term of this agreement Commercial General Liability Insurance specifically including Police Professional Liability, bodily injury, personal injury and property damage limits of \$3,000,000 per occurrence.

In the event that either party is self-insured, member of an intergovernmental pool or provides for its risk financing by a means other than commercial insurance, it shall keep in force at all times during the term of this agreement, General Liability coverage specifically including Police Professional Liability, bodily injury, personal injury and property damage limits of \$3,000,000 per occurrence.

Each party shall furnish certificates of the insurance and/or coverage in place as required herein and including a 90-day notice of cancellation or reduction in limits. The policy and/or coverage shall name the other party as an additional insured and shall also contain a "contractual liability" clause.

**Section 7:** If any provision of this Agreement is held to be invalid for any reason, such invalidation shall not render invalid other provisions of this Agreement which can be given effect without the invalid provision.

**Section 8:** This Agreement shall be effective when executed by the District and City. Unless otherwise terminated by either party, this Agreement shall be effective for a term of one (1) year and be automatically renewed for successive terms of one (1) year each unless either party notifies the other in writing of non-renewal at least ninety (90) days before the end of the applicable term.

**Section 9:** Either party hereto may terminate this Agreement for any violation of its terms by providing the offending party with thirty (30) days advance written notice. Either party hereto may also terminate this Agreement for any reason or no reason at all by giving the other party at least ninety (90) days advance written notice.

**Section 10:** Any other agreement or agreements between the parties hereto concerning the subjects hereof are terminated and canceled upon approval hereof, and this Agreement shall be the only agreement between the parties regarding the subject matter hereof.

**Section 11:** Notice or other writings which any party is required to, or may wish to, serve upon any other party in connection with this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be delivered personally or sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, addressed as follows:

**THIS AGREEMENT** is entered into by and between the **NORTH BERWYN PARK DISTRICT** (hereinafter referred to as the "District") and the **CITY OF BERWYN** (hereinafter referred to as the "City"), both municipal corporations located in the County of Cook, State of Illinois;

**WITNESSETH:**

**WHEREAS**, the Illinois Constitution provides that units of local government may contract to share services through intergovernmental agreements, Ill.Const., Art. VII, §10 (1970); and

**WHEREAS**, Illinois statutes provide that public agencies may share powers through intergovernmental agreements pursuant to the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (5 ILCS 220/1 et seq. (1991)); and

**WHEREAS**, the District desires that its laws, ordinances, rules and regulations be enforced by the City within its parks, grounds and facilities; and

**WHEREAS**, the City operates a police force including police officers and required vehicles and equipment; and

**WHEREAS**, the City has determined that it is feasible and appropriate that its police officers enforce the laws, ordinances, rules and regulations of the District within its parks, grounds and facilities within the corporate limits of the City; and

**WHEREAS**, the City and the District wish to associate, cooperate and share services to achieve the goals and objectives expressed herein and to enter into an intergovernmental agreement that so provides.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual agreements and covenants contained in this Agreement, the District and the City agree as follows:

**Section 1:** City police officers shall be authorized at all times to enforce the laws, ordinances, rules and regulations of the District upon the parks, grounds and facilities of the District within the corporate limits of the City and to sign and file complaints for any violation thereof. Under this provision, no City police officers, vehicles or equipment shall be specifically designated for park patrol, but rather in the normal course of patrol and on call, the City police officers shall so enforce the laws in the parks, grounds and facilities of the District. The District shall make payment to the City for the enforcement services at a rate of \$15/hour or the current rate.

specific means, manner and methods used in providing the law enforcement and police services contemplated by this agreement.

It is further understood that said police officers are not agents or employees of the Park District and are therefore not entitled to any benefits provided employees of Park District.

**Section 3:** This Agreement shall not be construed as to limit in any way the authority or ability of the police officers of the City to enforce the laws of the City, State of Illinois and United States as otherwise authorized by applicable law, either on or off of the property of the District.

**Section 4:** Members of the City Police Department, acting hereunder to enforce the laws on District property, shall be conservators of the peace within and upon such parks and property controlled by the District and shall act in the same capacity as present auxiliary officers.

**Section 5:** The prosecutor for the City shall prosecute any citation written by a police officer alleging violation of a District law, ordinance, rule or regulation, and is hereby authorized to represent the District with reference thereto.

**Section 6:** To the fullest extent permitted by law, each party shall protect, indemnify, save, defend and hold harmless the other party, including its officers, officials, volunteers, employees and agents, from and against any and all liabilities, obligations, claims, damages, penalties, causes of action, costs and expenses, including reasonable attorney and paralegal fees, which the other party and for which its officers, officials, volunteers, employees and agents may become obligated by reason of any accident, bodily injury, death of person, or loss of or damage to tangible property, or civil and/or constitutional infringement of rights (specifically including violations of the Federal Civil Rights Statutes) arising indirectly or directly in connection with or under, or as a result of this agreement; but only to the extent caused in whole or in part by any negligent or wrongful act or omission of the indemnifying party.

In the event either party purchases insurance from an insurance company, it shall keep in force at all times during the term of this agreement Commercial General Liability Insurance specifically including Police Professional Liability, bodily injury, personal injury and property damage limits of \$3,000,000 per occurrence.

In the event that either party is self-insured, member of an intergovernmental pool or provides for its risk financing by a means other than commercial insurance, it shall keep in force at all times during the term of this agreement, General Liability coverage specifically including Police Professional Liability, bodily injury, personal injury and property damage limits of \$3,000,000 per occurrence, per terms of the City insurance policy.

Each party shall furnish certificates of the insurance and/or coverage in place as required herein and including a 90-day notice of cancellation or reduction in limits. The policy and/or coverage shall name the other party as an additional insured and shall also contain a "contractual liability" clause.

**Section 7:** If any provision of this Agreement is held to be invalid for any reason, such invalidation shall not render invalid other provisions of this Agreement which can be given effect without the invalid provision.

**Section 8:** This Agreement shall be effective when executed by the District and City. Unless

otherwise terminated by either party, this Agreement shall be effective for a term of one (1) year and be automatically renewed for successive terms of one (1) year each unless either party notifies the other in writing of non-renewal at least ninety (90) days before the end of the applicable term.

**Section 9:** Either party hereto may terminate this Agreement for any violation of its terms by providing the offending party with thirty (30) days advance written notice. Either party hereto may also terminate this Agreement for any reason or no reason at all by giving the other party at least ninety (90) days advance written notice.

**Section 10:** Any other agreement or agreements between the parties hereto concerning the subjects hereof are terminated and canceled upon approval hereof, and this Agreement shall be the only agreement between the parties regarding the subject matter hereof.

**Section 11:** Notice or other writings which any party is required to, or may wish to, serve upon any other party in connection with this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be delivered personally or sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, addressed as follows:

**Section 13:** This Agreement is entered into solely for the benefit of the contracting parties, and nothing in this Agreement is intended, either expressly or impliedly, to provide any right or benefit of any kind whatsoever to any person or entity who is not a party to this Agreement, or to acknowledge, establish or impose any legal duty to any third party.

**INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT  
FOR FOOD SERVICE ESTABLISHMENT INSPECTIONS**

**BETWEEN  
THE CITY OF BERWYN, ILLINOIS  
AND  
THE BERWYN PUBLIC HEALTH DISTRICT**

This Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement (hereafter referred to as the "Agreement") is entered into on the dates set forth below, by and between the **City of Berwyn, Illinois** (hereafter referred to as the "City"), and the **Berwyn public Health District**, hereafter referred to as the "Health District.")

WHEREAS, each of the parties is a political subdivision of the State Of Illinois, and is a unit of local government organized and existing under the laws of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Section Ten (10) of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution and Section 5 ILCS 220/1 et seq. of the Illinois Compiled Statutes authorizes units of local government to jointly exercise any powers, privileges and/or authorities which may be exercised by any public agency; and

WHEREAS, that the Berwyn Public Health District was created in 1921 by referendum, and Berwyn was the first City in the State to create a separate Public Health Authority. Under the Illinois Public Health District Act. (70 ILCS 905/1 et seq.) the Health District is charged with the responsibility to enforce all health and sanitation statutes and ordinances within the City; and

WHEREAS, since its inception, the City and the Health District have had an informal intergovernmental cooperation agreement, that the Health District would provide all inspectional services concerning health, sanitation, food service and other business license inspections for the City. Further, since the ordinances of the City have been codified, the City has designated the Health District as the enforcement agency for all City Ordinances related to health and sanitation and all businesses related thereto; a role that the Health District has freely accepted.

WHEREAS; recent developments in statutory mandates now require that all food sanitation inspections must be supervised by a Licensed Environmental Health Practitioner (LEHP) (225 ILCS 37/23). Further, the Illinois Municipal Code for the first

time now mandates that the City is responsible to insure the proper inspection and regulation retail food establishments; and

WHEREAS, the Health District retains the services of a LEHP in compliance with state statute; and the Health District's and City's long-standing informal cooperation agreement regarding food service inspections is compliant with state mandates; the parties believe it appropriate to ratify these arrangements through a formal Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement, given these recent statutory developments; and

WHEREAS, each of the parties hereto strives to provide quality public services and maintain an orderly health and food sanitation inspection program for a safe and healthy community.

NOW HEREOF. IT IS AGREED THAT the parties hereto do further formalize their existing association, partnership and agreement for the implementation of a comprehensive health and food sanitation inspection program, on the terms and conditions as set forth herein:

#### **ARTICLE I - PURPOSE**

The City and the Health District acknowledge and agree that there is a continuing need for a comprehensive plan for health and sanitation inspections, and specifically for business licenses and food service establishments within the City Of Berwyn. They further understand that each party, under current law, has certain obligations and authority concerning the issue; and the parties have been cooperating since 1921 to implement consistent protocols and procedures for these inspection programs. The purpose of this Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement is to continue to develop, establish and implement such inspection programs.

#### **ARTICLE II - AUTHORITY AND DUTIES**

1. The parties acknowledge and agree that the City has business licensing authority and therefore must insure initial and ongoing code compliance for all business entities within the City.

2. The Health District is enabled and authorized by State Statute and local ordinance to enforce all laws relating to public health and sanitation. Further, the Health District has certain expertise and resources invaluable for the implementation of any health, sanitation and food service inspection program related to licensed business entities within the City.

3. Nothing in this agreement is intended to alter, modify or shift any current mandates or responsibilities between the parties. Nor does either party waive, relinquish or transfer any jurisdictional authority that it currently possesses, whether exercised or not.

4. The parties will adopt such additional Resolutions and Ordinances required to properly implement the food service inspection program.

5. The Health District shall provide to the City, its LEHP, who shall provide inspectional and/or supervisory services for the City, at the City's direction, for the regulation and inspection of all retail food establishments within the City of Berwyn. The parties will cooperate to schedule the LEHP's time, so as to avoid conflicts and so that the needs of both parties are efficiently met.

6. For planning purposes both parties shall accurately track all resources dedicated to the food service inspection program, including, but not limited to, finances, supplies, printing, training and employee hours, and will share this data with the other party upon request.

7. The parties (through their appropriate representatives and designees) agree to meet periodically as required under the circumstances; but in no event less than once per year. Each party agrees that it will meaningfully participate in said meetings by sending knowledgeable representatives from all key departments. The purpose of the meeting will be to discuss all aspects of the business license inspection program.

### **ARTICLE III - FINANCES AND FUNDING**

1. The parties understand and agree that the cost of LEHP services that are currently being provided to the City by the Health District for regulation and inspection of food service establishments, are now funded fully by the Health District, and will continue to be funded by the Health District under this Agreement.

2. Notwithstanding the foregoing however, the parties understand and agree that should the City desire to retain the services of the Health District's LEHP, for services

outside of the scope of those set forth in this Agreement, nothing in this Agreement shall prevent the City from doing so, at its sole cost and expense.

#### **ARTICLE IV - WITHDRAWAL / TERMINATION**

1. The parties to this Agreement understand and agree that this Agreement shall extend in perpetuity until termination is effected by mutual agreement or by a party as hereafter set forth:

A. Either party may terminate the Agreement, with or without cause, at the end of any fiscal year, which for the purpose of this Article shall be considered the City's fiscal year of December 31<sup>st</sup>. Notice of termination shall be given sixty (60) days prior to the end of the fiscal year.

B. If either part fails to approve its funding portion (if any) of the food service establishment inspection program; or if either party fails to budget and/or appropriate its funding responsibilities; or if either party fails to fund its agreed and approved funding obligation, then the other party may withdraw from the Program with sixty (60) days Notice to the other party.

2. In the event of termination of this Agreement, the fiscal obligations of the parties shall not be abrogated or terminated if contractual obligations remain and extend beyond the termination date. The parties agree to use good faith and best efforts to mitigate any expenses and damages.

#### **ARTICLE V - MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**

1. All Notices hereunder shall be served in writing to the Mayor or Health District President at their corporate offices. Notice shall be deemed served and received if transmitted via facsimile before 5:00 pm on the day of service, with another copy placed in regular US mail on that same day.

2. The agreements, covenants, terms and conditions of this Agreement may only be modified through the written mutual consent of the parties.

3. Nothing within this agreement in any way modifies or abridges any rights, powers or authority granted to the parties, either jointly or severally, by any law or ordinance. Nothing in this Agreement precludes a party from unilaterally utilizing its

powers or jurisdictional authority to enforce any law or ordinance with respect to any matter covered within this Agreement.

4. The parties acknowledge and agree that each has sufficient liability insurance coverage that insures the agency for any and all acts and/or omissions envisioned or reasonably contemplated within this food service establishment inspectional program. Neither party will seek reimbursement from the other for any loss or claim occasioned by any act or omission by its own staff, agents or officers. Each party will indemnify and hold the other party harmless for any and all loss, costs, expenses, claims and/or damages, including reasonable attorney's fees, occasioned by any act or omission by its own employees, staff, officers or agents with respect to this program.

5. This Agreement shall become effective upon its approval in accordance with the law by the respective corporate authorities of the City and the Health District

Informational purpose only.

Honorable Mayor Lovero and Members of City Council,

On Monday evening December 12, 2011 at 6:25 pm. The Berwyn Fire Department received a call for an oven fire at 3831 Clinton. Engine 901 arrived on the scene and extinguished a fire in the oven. At 6:34 pm. Berwyn Police Officer James Tradrowski, while handling an automobile accident at 38<sup>th</sup> and Oak Park Ave was flagged down by a citizen who was reporting he saw smoke from the rear of 3832 S. Oak Park Ave. Officer James Tradrowski responded to the report of smoke. Commander Michael Cimaglia was also dispatched to the report of smoke. The Berwyn Fire units on the street at the previous call were dispatched to the fire on Oak Park Ave also. It should be noted that Engine 901 was delayed due to the fact that they had to disconnect hose laid out in the street, and abandon the hose to respond to the second call a working fire.

Officer James Tradrowski responded to 3832 S. Oak Park Ave and found smoke coming from the rear of the home. Officer Tradrowski then forced open the front, attempting to determine if there were any occupants in the home. He then ran around the rear of the building and forced open the rear door trying to determine if there was anyone in the home. At this time Commander Michael Cimaglia arrived on the scene and was assisting Officer Tradrowski. Officer Tradrowski heard an occupant respond to his call and the occupant was calling for help. Officer Tradrowski then entered the smoke filled rear entrance of the home calling for the occupant to come to his direction. Commander Cimaglia was

waiting at the rear entrance of the home and keeping in contact with his Officer. At this time Berwyn Fire Engine 903 with Lieutenant Tom Hayes, Engineer John Janata and firefighter Brian Marquardt arrived on the scene did an initial size up of the incident. Lt. Hayes and firefighter Brian Marquardt dropped a hose line, and stretched it to the rear of the home. When they arrived at the rear entrance of the home they found Commander Cimaglia at the rear door. Officer Tradrowski was in the home and pulling the Occupant who was burned and overcome by smoke out of the smoke filled kitchen. LT. Hayes, Commander Cimaglia, Firefighter Marquardt, and Officer Tradrowski carried the victim out of the hazardous conditions and to the rear yard. Seconds after the members removed the victim from the home, the kitchen and hallway that they were just were in, flashed over into fire. Commander Cimaglia and Officer Tradrowski carried the victim out to the front of the home for Emergency medical treatment. Lt. Hayes and Firefighter Marquardt began to extinguish the fire in the kitchen. Deputy Chief Kris Coniglio arrived on the scene and assumed Incident Command.

The Alarm was raised to a full response of all Berwyn Units, and then raised to a MABAS Box alarm bringing in additional equipment and staffing to assist in the extinguishment, search and rescue, ventilation and EMS duties. Ambulance 906 arrived on the scene and began the EMS treatment of the victim. The victim was treated for burns and smoke inhalation and transported to Loyola Hospital Emergency Room. Shortly a second ambulance was called to the scene to attend to Officer Tradrowski, and Commander Cimaglia who also inhaled smoke during their rescue effort. Officer Tradrowski was treated on the scene and eventually transported to Mac Neal Hospital for precautionary measures. The victim is still in Loyola Hospital being treated for an inhalation injury and second degree burns to his head, back and legs. Thankfully Officer Tradrowski was released from the Hospital the same night.

I would like to again mention the cooperation and team work between both departments in this effort to rescue a citizen from a building that was on fire and filled with smoke. Without cooperation in this incident, the outcome would have been worse. I would like to commend the remaining team members of the Berwyn Fire Department red shift, the Berwyn Police Officers, Community Service Officers, 911 Dispatchers, and Berwyn Emergency Services and Disaster Agency for their support during this incident. Once again the team work between all departments assisted in saving one of our citizen's lives.

Without the support of Mayor Robert Lovero and Members of City Council support with these departments giving us adequate staffing to respond in a professional fashion, outcomes such as this would not be possible.

Joe Lotito, Engineer George Buffo, FF Patrick Sharkey, Ambulance 905 FF/PM Brian Madden, FF/PM Brandon Keag, Ambulance 906 FF/PM Dominic Licato, and FF/EMT Tim Berwick.

My congratulations for a job well done, goes out to all involved in this outstanding team effort with good results for a job well done.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 484.03 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BERWYN, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS REGARDING DEPOT AND BUSINESS RESERVED PERMIT PARKING**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois (the "City ") is a home rule municipality pursuant to Section 6(a), Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and as such may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs (the "Home Rule Powers"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Berwyn (the "Corporate Authorities") operates parking spaces offering reserved vehicle parking for a permit fee; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities recognizes the need for municipal permit parking spaces along Roosevelt Road, and that these designated areas be evaluated from time to time and adjusted as necessary; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities determine that all permit parking space expenses and costs should be paid by user fees generated from the sale of parking space permits, and that user fees should be evaluated from time to time and adjusted as necessary.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its Home Rule Powers, as follows:

**Section 1:** That the above recitals and legislative findings are incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

**Section 2:** Section 484.03 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois is hereby amended to read as follows (with proposed additions underlined and proposed deletions ~~stricken~~):

484.03 DEPOT, ~~AND~~ BUSINESS RESERVED AND MUNICIPAL PERMIT PARKING

(A) Council shall establish certain parking spaces within the City as permit parking only spaces, such spaces to be designated by signs indicating "Depot Permit Parking Only", ~~or "Business Reserved Permit Parking"~~ or "Municipal Permit Parking".

(B) ~~Depot, and~~ business reserved and municipal permits to park in such spaces are available upon application to the City Collector on a form to be provided for this purpose, which application shall include the name, address and telephone number of the applicant.

(C) Locations and Fees.

(1) The fee for a Depot Parking Permit is one-hundred dollars (\$100.00) per quarter or three hundred and seventy five dollars (\$375.00) per year, and the number of permits shall be limited by availability. All parking spaces designated as "Depot Permit Parking" shall be used as public parking after 6:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m., Monday through Friday and all day Saturday, Sunday and holidays.

(a) Depot Permit Parking is available along the north side of Windsor Avenue and the south side of Stanley Avenue, in which the designated spaces are clearly marked with signs.

(b) ~~Depot Permits Parking, also signed as Commuter Permit Parking, is available in the first 300 spaces~~ can be used on levels 1, 2, 3 and 4 of the Municipal Garage located at 3320 Grove Avenue.

(2) The fee for a Business reserved parking permit ~~is one hundred and seventy five dollars (\$175.00)~~ two hundred and twenty five dollars (\$225.00) per year, and the number of permits shall be marked or otherwise limited by availability. Business Permit Parking shall be valid from 7am-7pm at these locations within the City:

- (a) West side of Kenilworth Avenue from Windsor Avenue to the first alley south (9 spaces).
- (b) East side of Clinton Avenue from Windsor Avenue to the first alley south (3 spaces).
- (c) East side of Home Avenue from Windsor Avenue to the first alley south (5 spaces).
- (d) South side of 32nd Street from Grove Avenue to the first alley west (3 spaces).
- (e) North side of 32nd Street from Oak Park Avenue to the first alley west (10 spaces).

- (f) South side of 32nd Street from Grove Avenue to Oak Park Avenue (3 spaces).
- (g) Two (2) spaces on Stanley Avenue at Oak Park Avenue.

**(3) The fee for a Municipal Parking Permit is two hundred and twenty five dollars (\$225.00) per year, and the number of permits shall be marked or otherwise limited by availability. Municipal Permit Parking shall be valid from 7am-5pm, Monday through Saturday, at these locations within the City:**

- (a) West side (3 spaces) and east side (4 spaces) of Wisconsin Avenue from Roosevelt Road to the alley south.**
- (b) West side of Clinton Avenue from Roosevelt Road to the cul-de-sac (4 spaces).**
- (c) East side of Kenilworth Avenue from Roosevelt Road to the alley south (8 spaces).**
- (d) West side (6 spaces) and east side (4 spaces) of Euclid Avenue from Roosevelt Road to the alley south.**
- (e) West side of Highland Avenue from Roosevelt Road to the alley south (10 spaces).**
- (f) East side of Harvey Avenue from Roosevelt Road to the alley south (6 spaces).**
- (g) West side of Lombard Avenue from Roosevelt Road to the alley south (7 spaces).**

(D) The City Collector may prorate the yearly fee ~~on a weekly or monthly basis~~ **after July 1 of each calendar year**. Such permit shall not be issued or renewed until the required fee is paid, and the permit is not transferable. In the event of the loss of such permit, the fee for replacement shall be ~~twenty five dollars (\$25.00)~~, **half of the original cost of the permit** and an application for such replacement shall be made to the City Collector.

(E) Depot, ~~and~~ business reserved **and municipal** parking permits shall be in hangtag form and in colors designated by the City Collector, shall be numbered and shall state the date of issuance and date of expiration. Such permits shall be displayed from the rearview mirror of the vehicle where they may be visible from the exterior of the vehicles.

(F) No vehicle which does not bear a Depot parking permit, ~~or~~ a Business reserved parking permit **or a Municipal parking permit** shall park in those spaces designated as "Depot Permit Parking Only" or "Business Reserved Permit Parking Only" or **"Municipal Permit Parking"**. All such spaces shall be designated as tow zones.

**Section 3.** All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**Section 4.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.





## § 484.09 CONDOMINIUM PERMIT PARKING

(A) Parking spaces throughout the City shall be designated as 24-hour permit parking only spaces, excepting street maintenance restrictions. The parking spaces shall be designated by signs clearly indicating these permitted areas.

(B) The locations are as follows:

- (1) North and south sides of 32<sup>nd</sup> Street from Harlem Avenue east to the first alley.
- (2) North side of 21<sup>st</sup> Street from Wesley Avenue west to the first alley.
- (3) South side of 18<sup>th</sup> Street from Elmwood Avenue west to the first alley.
- (4) North side of 18<sup>th</sup> Street from Gunderson Avenue east to the first alley.

(C) The sign shall include the name of the street housing the permitted parking followed by "Condo Permit Parking Only".

(D) Permits for parking within the applicable areas described above shall be issued only in accordance with the following:

(1) Availability. Parking permits will be issued for each calendar year on an as-available basis by the City Collector upon application and payment of all applicable fees identified herein to any resident who is domiciled in the multi-unit building that is granted use of the applicable parking areas described above. The parking permits shall be valid from ~~January~~ July 1 through ~~December 31~~ June 30 of each calendar year and limited to one per household. No residential parking permit shall be issued to a vehicle with outstanding city parking tickets.

(2) Application. Applications for parking permits under this section shall be submitted to the City Collector on a form to be provided by the City Collector. The application shall include:

- a. Name, address and proof of residence;
- b. Vehicle make, city vehicle sticker number and license plate number; and
- c. Other information as the City Collector may reasonably require to implement this section.

(3) Fees. The yearly permit fee for a residential parking permit under this section shall be ~~\$175~~ **two hundred and twenty five dollars (\$225.00) per year.** ~~Permits may be offered for a quarterly rate of \$50 per quarter.~~ All fees paid pursuant to this section shall be nonrefundable. Any permit fees shall be prorated after ~~July~~ December 1 of each calendar year. **In the event of the loss of such permit, the fee for replacement shall be half of the original cost of the permit and an application for such replacement shall be made to the City Collector.**

(4) Form. The parking permits shall be in placard form and in colors uniquely designated by the City Collector for each calendar year. The parking permits shall be numbered and shall state the date of expiration.

(E) The City Collector shall promulgate the Condominium Permit Parking rules and regulations to supplement the requirements set forth herein. A copy of the rules and regulations shall be available to permit holders in the City Collector's office and shall be made available to each permit holder when a renewal permit is issued if substantive changes are made to the rules and regulations.

(1) ~~Parking permits shall be displayed on passenger side dashboards of the vehicles~~ **be in hangtag form and in colors designated by the City Collector, shall be numbered and shall state the date of issuance and date of expiration. Such permits shall be displayed from the rearview mirror of the vehicle where they may be visible from the exterior of the vehicles.**

(2) Residential parking permits shall be nontransferable.

(3) No person shall use a residential parking permit on a vehicle for which the permit was not issued.

(4) No person shall duplicate or attempt to duplicate the residential parking permit.

(5) Any permit issued pursuant to this section may be revoked for any violation herein.

(F) No vehicle which does not bear a properly displayed Condominium parking permit shall park in those spaces identified as such within the applicable areas as described above. All spaces shall be designated as tow zones.

**Section 3.** All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**Section 4.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

- ~~(9) No person shall use a Commercial Vehicle Vacin Fairway Permit by placing such parking permit on a vehicle for which permit was not issued or properly transferred.~~





**WHEREAS**, the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois (the "City") is a home rule municipality pursuant to Section 6(a), Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and as such may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs (the "Home Rule Powers"); and

**WHEREAS**, the City regulates the overnight parking of commercial vehicles in the City pursuant to Chapter 480.03 of its Codified Ordinances; and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Berwyn (the "Corporate Authorities") recognizes the need for commercial vehicle parking in City parking lots; and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Berwyn (the "Corporate Authorities") has decided to modify Chapter 480.03 to improve the efficiency of parking in City parking lots; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities determine that it is in the best interests of the residents of the City to amend the Codified Ordinances as set forth below.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its Home Rule Powers, as follows:

**Section 1:** Section 480.03, Chapter 480, Parking of Mobile Homes, Snow Plows and Other Heavy Vehicles is hereby amended to read as follows; (with proposed additions underlined and proposed deletions ~~stricken~~):

**Section 2:** If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Ordinance.

**480.03 PARKING OF MOBILE HOMES, SNOW PLOWS AND OTHER HEAVY VEHICLES.**

(a) Except as otherwise provided in this Traffic Code, no person shall park, in any street, alley or parkway in the City, any pickup camper (with a cap higher than six inches above the cab roof), van that exceeds the manufacturer's height, motor home, mobile home, boat or boat trailer, other trailer, tractor, bus, truck whose gross weight exceeds three-fourths of a ton or vehicle of the first or second division, as defined in the Illinois Vehicle Code, when such vehicle is equipped with an attached snow plow.

(b) No person owning, controlling, driving or operating a commercial vehicle shall cause or permit such vehicle to stand or be parked on the streets or in the alleys of the City for a period of time longer than is necessary for:

- (1) The reasonably expeditious loading or unloading of passengers;
- (2) The reasonably expeditious loading, unloading and delivery or pick-up of material; or
- (3) The reasonably expeditious completion of a requested service call or performance of a requested service.

(c) A permit may be granted, for a maximum stay of forty-eight hours, for one, unoccupied, mobile home or motor home per family to be parked on a residential street, provided that the permit for the stay is obtained by the owner thereof from the Police Department in advance of such parking. The permit shall be displayed in the front windshield of the mobile home or motor home and may be granted not more than twice in a twelve-month period. (Adopting Ordinance)

(d) As used in this section, "commercial vehicle" means a vehicle:

- (1) Having an Illinois license plate bearing one or more letters of the alphabet, except "RV" or "CV", preceded by a number;
- (2) Having a written advertisement on the vehicle indicating or promoting a business enterprise for hire;
- (3) Having ladder racks, ladders, brackets, tools or any other paraphernalia in plain view making it obvious that the vehicle is being used for a business enterprise; or
- (4) Registered to any legal entity, i.e. a sole proprietorship, a partnership or a corporation.

Commercial vehicles as described hereinabove shall not be parked upon any public way between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. of the following day, any day of the week.

(e) The following commercial vehicles are exempt from the provisions of this section:

- (1) All public utility vehicles used for emergency purposes parked for the necessary period of time to complete and restore all services; and
- (2) All rental trucks and moving vans parked overnight for one night with the approval and authorization of the Police Department.

Commercial vehicles as described hereinabove shall not be parked between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. of the following day, any day of the week, in the following locations:

~~(2)~~(1) West Library Parking Lot

**WHEREAS**, the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois (the “City”) is a home rule municipality pursuant to Section 6(a), Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and as such may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs (the “Home Rule Powers”); and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Berwyn (the “Corporate Authorities”) has adopted a Traffic Code, which has been amended from time to time; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities recognize that parking regulations are important to the fabric and safety of the community and must be upheld; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities determine that it is in the best interests of the residents of the City to amend the Codified Ordinances as set forth below.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its Home Rule Powers, as follows:

**Section 2:** Section 480.09 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois is hereby amended to read as follows (with proposed additions underlined and proposed deletions ~~stricken~~):

#### 480.09 OVERNIGHT PARKING AND LOCATIONS

Overnight Parking is allowed in the following areas under the conditions as provided in this Traffic Code. All vehicles parked in accordance to this chapter must also abide to any provisions set forth in Section 480.05 Street Cleaning and Snow Emergency Parking Restrictions.

- (a) Vacin Fairway. Overnight Parking is between the hours of 10 pm and 6 am of the following day, any day of the week. Overnight Parking is permitted:
  - (1) For passenger vehicles and motorcycles displaying Berwyn resident parking permits (also referred to as "vehicle sticker).
  - (2) For non-resident passenger vehicles and motorcycles displaying Vacin Fairway Permits.
  - (3) For non-resident passenger vehicles and motorcycles displaying a legally obtained and properly displayed Berwyn visitor parking pass or temporary visitor parking pass.
  - (4) For ~~resident and non-resident~~ commercial vehicles, as defined in Chapter 480.03, with a Commercial Vehicle ~~Vacin Fairway~~ **Parking** Permit.
- (b) **Stanley and Windsor Avenues Depot Parking. Overnight Parking is between the hours of 6 pm and 7 am of the following day, any day of the week. Overnight Parking is permitted:**
  - (1) **For commercial vehicles, as defined in Chapter 480.03, with a Commercial Vehicle Parking Permit, along the BNSF rail line between Wisconsin Avenue and Home Avenue and between East Avenue and Ridgeland Avenue.**
- (c) **Library East Lot. Overnight Parking is between the hours of 9 pm and 7 am of the following day, any day of the week. Overnight Parking is permitted:**
  - (1) **For passenger vehicles and motorcycles displaying Berwyn resident parking permits (also referred to as "vehicle sticker).**
  - (2) **For non-resident passenger vehicles and motorcycles displaying a legally obtained and properly displayed Berwyn visitor parking pass or temporary visitor parking pass.**

(3) For commercial vehicles, as defined in Chapter 480.03, with a Commercial Vehicle Parking Permit.

**Section 3.** All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.







**484.10 COMMERCIAL VEHICLE PARKING PERMITS**

Council shall establish parking spaces throughout the City designated as commercial vehicle permit parking as outlined in section 480.09 Overnight Parking.

- (1) Permits are available for commercial vehicles as defined in Section 480.03.
- (2) Permits are also available for taxi cabs and limousines.
- (3) Permits are available upon application to the Police Department – Parking Division or the Collector’s Office, on a form to be provided for that purpose.
- (4) Said form shall include the name, address and phone number of the applicant and the license plate number, make and color of the vehicle to which the permit will apply.
- (5) Permits are available on a yearly basis, from January 1 to December 31 of a given year.
- (6) The fee for a Commercial Vehicle Parking Permit is one-hundred and twenty dollars (\$120.00) per quarter and three hundred dollars (\$300.00) per year.
- (7) All permits shall be prorated after July 1 of each calendar year. In the event of the loss of such permit, the fee for replacement shall be half of the original cost of the permit.
- (8) Permits are to be in a placard form that can be hung from the rear-view mirror and shall be properly displayed from this location when the commercial vehicle is parked in the designated locations. The parking permits shall be numbered and shall state the date of expiration.
- (9) Permits are not transferable.
- (10) No person shall use a Commercial Vehicle Parking Permit by placing such parking permit on a vehicle for which permit was not issued or properly transferred.

**Section 3.** All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Re: MUTCD Compliance for sign assessment method

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) has revised the compliance dates for the replacement of signs that do not meet the provisions in the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD). However, existing devices in the field that do not meet the new MUTCD provisions are expected to be upgraded by highway agencies over time to meet the new provisions through the local agency's standard replacement process, but there are no specific dates for the required completion of the upgrades. The FHWA has also revised the compliance date for an assessment or management method requiring agencies to maintain the appropriate level of retroreflectivity. The revised date is August 2013. Agencies will be required to adopt the amendments presented or have an assessment method in place by January 22, 2012.

The City has an assessment method currently in place. All streets have been surveyed for signs and the signs are entered into a database. Each sign is entered in the database with all pertinent information, such as address of posting, mounting type, color, size, text etc. All new signs that are posted have been equipped with a sign dating sticker. All new signs posted are per a signing project or on an as need basis i.e. graffiti, damage, faded due to age, etc. All new signs are kept track of in the database in which their retroreflectivity is documented. Signs without dating stickers, in which the age of the sign is unknown, will be systematically replaced. Through proper documentation of sign age and material, Public Works can then determine the useful life of a sign exposed to the elements and will be able to replace signs when nearing their useful life expectancy. Blanket sign replacement by age is an accepted replacement method a by the FHWA.

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the current assessment and management method developed by Public Works staff is approved by Council.

Re: Recommendation to Approve the Purchase of a One Ton Dump Truck

The City of Berwyn Public Works Department is requesting permission to replace a 1999 Ford F350 Pick Up Truck with a 2011 Ford F350 Dump Truck from the Municipal Purchasing Program. The Public Works Department staff has located a 2011 Ford F350 4X4 to replace the above mentioned vehicle. This unit is already equipped with a dump body and hydraulics and will also include a full 3 year warranty. I located this vehicle at Rizza Ford in their vehicle stock at a list cost of approximately \$49,000. With the municipal purchasing pricing and additional negotiated dealer discounts on this vehicle, the final cost is \$32,525.00.

Per discussions with the Finance Department, I also requested lease/purchase information on this vehicle. The interest rate under the lease concept is 6.4% with the following options; 8 semi-annual payments of \$4586.84 for a total cost of \$36,694.72 OR 10 semi-annual payments of \$3789.05 for a total cost of \$37,890.50.

My recommendation is to purchase instead of lease at a total cost of \$32,525. This unit is budgeted for fiscal year 2011 within the 2007 Capitol Bond and not from the general fund.

**Recommended Actions;**

Staff recommends purchase of the 2011 Ford F350 4 X 4 dump truck from Rizza Ford for a total cost of \$32,525.

Bids were received and opened for the above-referenced project at 10:00 a.m. on December 21, 2011. Six (6) bids were received, checked for accuracy, and found to be correct.

Enclosed are two (2) Tabulations of the bids for your review. The first is entitled "Base Bids Only" and the other is entitled "All Alternate Bids". The Specifications for this project afforded the Contractor the option to provide prices for five Alternate Bid Items, as shown on Page 2 of the enclosed Tabulations. Items 1 through 4 are to use "Hapco/Hadco" lighting units rather than the specified "Sternberg" units. Item No. 5 is to provide a price to Power Coat the Pedestrian Light Poles.

The low bidder on the base bid only items was Elmund & Nelson Company, submitting a bid in the amount of \$733,803.00, which was \$315,498.00 (30.07%) below the Engineer's Estimate of \$1,049,301.00.

The low bidder on the base bid with alternate items was Lyons Electric Company, submitting a bid in the amount of \$719,495.59, which was \$329,805.41 (31.43%) below the Engineer's Estimate of \$1,049,301.00.

Bob Schiller and I discussed the details of the project, and compared the prices and materials. We determined that the alternate prices provided by Lyons Electric Company would be the most economical for the City. Therefore, it is our recommendation to award the contract to **Lyons Electric Company, 650 E. Elm Avenue, LaGrange, IL 60525**, in the amount of **\$719,495.59**.


